

EIA Seeks Applicants for 2009 EIA Summer Internship Program Washington, DC June – August 2009

[The Energy Information Administration \(EIA\)](#), the Nation's premier source of unbiased energy data, analyses and forecasting, invites qualified students, both undergraduate and graduate, to apply for a summer internship at our headquarters in Washington, D.C.

Opportunities are available to students from a variety of academic disciplines, particularly for those with majors in areas such as **Economics, Mathematics, Statistics, Engineering, Operations Research, Business/Finance, & Web Development.**

Duties and responsibilities will vary according to internal program office assignment and can range from challenging tasks such as assisting with data analysis & forecasting, developing and designing modeling systems, surveys or reports, researching trends and issues in domestic and international energy markets, to participating in website content and development. Internships are paid according to the Federal government GS pay schedule and, depending on academic standing and experience; salaries usually range from \$5,200 to \$9,500 for the ten-week program.

In addition to gaining valuable quality work experience, EIA summer interns will have the opportunity to meet with senior-level EIA officials and congressional staff, as well as participate in several networking activities (including off-site field trips) that should greatly enhance their knowledge of the energy industry.

Application deadline for summer internships is February 27, 2009.

To be considered for a summer internship at EIA, you must meet the basic eligibility requirements:

- 1) Be a U.S. citizen;
- 2) Be currently enrolled in an accredited 4-year college or university, with rising sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate status; and in good standing with the accredited institution.

Applications will be reviewed on a regular basis and only qualified applicants will be contacted for interviews. Applicants also are encouraged to provide a copy of their transcript in order to expedite processing. (An unofficial copy of the transcript is acceptable for submission with the application.)

If you are selected for a summer intern position, you also may be entitled to receive the following Federal benefits and subsidies:

- Paid Federal holidays that fall within your regularly scheduled tour of duty, and
- Transit Subsidy - partial or complete subsidized transportation costs if you utilize public transportation to or from EIA.
