Refinery operable capacity utilization for the 4 weeks ending February 19, 1999, was slightly below last year's rate. This week's operable capacity utilization rate was 91.8 percent. The 4 week average for motor gasoline production was 4 percent above last year's level, while distillate fuel oil production was about the same.

Crude oil stocks were 3.0 MMB higher than last week's level. Motor gasoline stocks were 3.3 MMB higher than last week's level. The current 229.3 MMB includes reformulated gasoline stocks of 43.8 MMB, but excludes oxygenate stocks of MTBE and fuel ethanol. At the end of January, they were about 8.8 MMB and 3.0 MMB respectively. Distillate stocks were 1.9 MMB lower than last week's level. They are 11.6 MMB above last year's level and are above the average range.

Net imports of crude oil and petroleum products during the 4 weeks ending February 19, 1999 were 9 percent higher than the levels for the same period last year.

Over the past four weeks, motor gasoline product supplied was 4 percent above last year's level, while distillate fuel oil product supplied was slightly below.

The average world crude oil price on February 19, 1999, was \$9.62 per barrel, up \$0.15 from the previous week but \$3.02 less than a year ago. WTI was \$11.79 per barrel on February 19, 1999, \$0.11 less than last week. The spot price for conventional gasoline in the New York Harbor was 30.53 cents per gallon, 0.50 cent higher than last week. The spot price for diesel fuel in the New York Harbor on February 19, 1999, was 30.46 cents per gallon, 0.73 cent more than last week.

On February 22, 1999, the national average retail regular gasoline price was 90.7 cents per gallon, down 1.2 cent from last week and 13.7 cents lower than a year ago. Establishing another record low, the national average retail diesel fuel price was 95.3 cents per gallon on February 22, 1999, down 0.6 cent from last week and 12.6 cents lower than last year.
