Refinery operable capacity utilization for the 4 weeks ending October 27, 2000, was slightly above last year's rate. This week's operable capacity utilization rate was 93.5 percent. The 4 week average for motor gasoline production was 2 percent below last year's level, while distillate fuel oil production remained at 9 percent above.

Crude oil stocks were 1.5 MMB lower than last week's level. Motor gasoline stocks were 4.1 MMB lower than last week's level. The current 188.1 MMB includes reformulated gasoline stocks of 38.1 MMB, but excludes oxygenate stocks of MTBE and fuel ethanol. At the end of September, they were about 7.4 MMB and 4.4 MMB, respectively. Distillate stocks were 1.4 MMB higher than last week's level. They are 26.1 MMB below last year's level, and are below the lower bound of the average range.

Net imports of crude oil and petroleum products during the 4 weeks ending October 27, 2000 were 7 percent higher than the levels for the same period last year.

Over the past four weeks, motor gasoline product supplied was slightly above last year's level, while distillate fuel oil product supplied was 4 percent above.

The average world crude oil price on October 27, 2000 was \$30.97 per barrel, up \$0.76 from the previous week and \$9.29 more than last year. WTI was \$32.78 per barrel on October 27, 2000, down \$1.53 from the previous week but \$10.99 more than last year. The spot price for conventional gasoline in the New York Harbor was 99.73 cents per gallon, down 0.07 cent from last week. The spot price for diesel fuel in the New York Harbor on October 27, 2000 was 99.43 cents per gallon, up 0.88 cent from last week.

The national average retail regular gasoline price decreased to 154.5 cents per gallon on October 30, 2000, down 0.6 cent from last week but 31.5 cents higher than a year ago. The national average retail diesel fuel price decreased for the second consecutive week to 162.9 cents per gallon on October 30, 2000, falling 1.9 cents from last week but 40.0 cents higher than last year.
